

Thursday- Worksheet 12a- Using imperative verbs.

Imperative verbs

Imperative verbs are commonly known as bossy verbs. They are verbs **which tell you what to do.**

Some examples of this are:

- **Eat** your lunch.
- **Tidy** the cloakroom.
- **Walk** home after school.

Task 1

Today, we will be writing the method section for how to make your pizza. First, look at the example given to you. Then read and highlight/ write down all of the imperative verbs you can see.

Task 2

Now it is your turn. Write out a brief recipe explaining how to make your pizza.

You will need:

- To use imperative verbs.
- Check for capital letters and full stops.
- Connectives such as, until, before, after, because, when
- To use fronted adverbials such as, First, Secondly, Next, After that,

Don't forget that a fronted adverbial is always followed by a **comma.**

Example

Firstly, **roll** out the pizza dough until it is in a large, circular shape.

Secondly, **pour** some of your juicy tomato sauce into the centre of your dough but not too much because you can add more if necessary. Then, using the back of a spoon **spread** it around the dough. Remember, **leave** a centimetre from the edge to create a crust.

After that, **place** your mushrooms and chicken evenly around the dough.

Next, **slice** one quarter of a chilli into tiny pieces before adding them to your pizza.

Then, **scatter** the golden cheese on top of the pizza.

Finally, **put** the pizza into the oven for roughly 15 minutes. **Allow** the pizza to cook while you clean the work station ready to prepare the next pizza order.

Once it is cooked, **remove** the pizza from the oven and **move** the pizza from the tray to a sparkling clean plate. **Place** the plate on the counter when you are ready for serving.
