
Developing self confidence


Equipping children with the skills to express their views confidently and clearly is a highly valued part of the work we do.


Culturally rich

Admissions

Our school serves the worshipping community of St. Joseph's Catholic Church, giving priority to practising Catholics. We are a successful, oversubscribed school, reflecting the vibrant parish community where practising the Faith is intrinsic to family life. The school's current admissions policy is available on the website or by contacting the school office.

Attendance

Children are expected to attend school everyday, unless unwell and we have a low level of absence. Absences for holidays are not authorised although some

authorised absence is permitted for children to

attend funerals, weddings and other religious events. Where attendance is of concern.

the school refers all cases to the Educational Welfare Service.

Behaviour

We expect school to be a happy experience for all children and everyone is expected to behave impeccably at all times.

We do not tolerate bullying. There are clear policies in place which are available from the school office.

Collective worship / Religious Education

The school gathers in small groups or as a whole community on a daily basis, when we pray and worship together. In line with the requirements of a Catholic school, at least 10% of our curriculum time is dedicated to Religious Education.

Curriculum

All children have access to a broad, balanced and rich curriculum. For all subjects learning is guided by the National Curriculum. For Religious Education we follow the national 'Here I Am' scheme. We teach Spanish as a second language. We adhere fully to statutory requirements.

Disability

All areas of the school are accessible by wheelchair. As the school undergoes changes as a result of expansion, better facilities are being incorporated.

Education in Personal Relationships (EPR)

EPR provides children with a thorough understanding of personal, social and health related development issues, which our children explore on a regular basis. This includes sex and relationships education, which begins at an early age progressing towards an understanding among our oldest children of the physical and emotional changes which take place as they become adults.

Equality

We recognise that all members of our community are equal but contribute in different unique ways towards the school's success. We are committed to ensuring that every child, parent and member of staff, regardless of role, feels equally valued and respected.

Friends of St. Joseph's

There is a very active and successful Friends of St. Joseph's, which has the dual purpose of arranging social events for the school community and fundraising. They enjoy a great deal of success and contribute hugely in terms of financial support to the school on an annual basis.

Gifted and talented

'Gifted and talented' describes children with an ability to develop to a level significantly ahead of their year group; 'gifted' learners are those who have abilities in one or more academic subjects, such as Maths and English; 'talented' learners are those who have practical skills in areas like sport, music, design or creative and performing arts. If you think your child is gifted or talented, you should discuss their abilities and needs with the relevant teacher.

Governing body

Ofsted wrote of Governors that they were 'exemplary'. The Chair of Governors is Mrs Sally Nestor. Details of other governors and their roles are available on the school website.

Home/school agreement

Prior to admission, all parents and students sign our home/school agreement. This details our shared expectations and is the foundation of the important partnership between home and school.

Looked after children

The term includes all children being looked after by the Local Authority. Our Special Educational Needs Co-ordinator (SENCo) is our designated member of staff; her role includes overseeing provision for any child in this category.

Monitoring progress

Children are assessed on an ongoing basis by their teachers in order to inform each child's next steps in learning. They are formally assessed at the end of Reception, Year 2 and Year 6 against nationally benchmarked tests. Parents enjoy regular contact with teachers throughout the year, with one to one meetings and open sessions when parents may view their child's work. All parents receive an Annual Report in July.

Special Educational Needs

We are proud that our children with Special Educational Needs (SEN) achieve very well. Our SENCo monitors their progress,

involving external agencies to support when necessary. We work to ensure that every child with SEN reaches their full potential in school.

Working with families

Parents are the first educators of their children and with the school and parish make up the

partnership which ensures that each child enjoys a successful and full development. The Working with Families Information Pack helps parents throughout the year to keep abreast of busy school life. It also outlines expectations that the school holds for attendance, uniform and behaviour and the important and primary role parents

enjoy in ensuring that each child adheres to school policy. We believe it is a parent's duty to ensure that their children are well-mannered, well-spoken and understand the rules of how to be polite and co-operative members of our community.

An invitation to you

We encourage parents to visit our school in order to find out more about how we work and the education that we offer. Tours of the school take place throughout the year. If you would like to make an appointment, please contact the school office and speak to one of our administrative team who will be very happy to arrange your visit.
